***** CLIMATE ACTION CAMPAIGN

A One-Day State Level Workshop on AP Climate Action Campaign was organized on 4th July 2025 at Vijayawada by the Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, Government of Andhra Pradesh, in collaboration with the Indian Red Cross Society, AP State Branch. Dr. K. Surya Chandra Rao, Principal of Government college for Women, Srikakulam participated in the workshop, which aimed to create awareness and promote initiatives towards climate action in the state. The sessions focused on strategies for environmental conservation, sustainable practices, and the role of educational institutions in combating climate change. ❖ Awareness programme on PCPNDT Act 1994

An awareness seminar on the prevention of child marriages and the *Pre-Conception and Pre-Natal Diagnostic Techniques (PCPNDT) Act* was organized on Wednesday 9th July 2025 at Government College for Women (Autonomous), Srikakulam. Smt. S. Vijaya L. Mohini, Deputy Health Education Officer, addressed the gathering and emphasized that child marriages cause significant physical, emotional, and social harm. She urged the students to gain thorough knowledge of the Gender Determination Act and its role in protecting the rights of the girl child. The programme aimed to educate students and staff about the provisions of the PCPNDT Act, its significance in preventing gender-biased sex selection, and the legal measures in place to safeguard the rights of the girl child. Resource persons highlighted the importance of public

awareness and community participation in ensuring effective implementation of the Act.She further stated that girls are excelling in all fields and should be empowered to pursue education and career opportunities without societal barriers. The session concluded with an interactive discussion encouraging students to spread awareness in their communities. Faculty members Smt. Y. Prasanthi students, and invited guests actively participated in the session, which concluded with an interactive discussion on ethical and legal responsibilities in promoting gender equality.
